Through our medical outreaches, thousands of individuals received access to quality healthcare services that many could not have otherwise afforded. We covered 5 LGAs in Kaduna State: Zangon-Kataf, Kagarko, Jaba, Kuru and Sanga.

Our skill empowerment programs equipped 46 young men and women with tools to build sustainable livelihoods, while our women empowerment initiatives gave over 1000 women the resources and confidence to become agents of change in their communities.

Education has remained at the heart of our work. By funding tuition fees and stipends for 36 undergraduate scholars, we

ensured that these brilliant young minds stayed in school, unhindered by financial barriers. Each of these efforts reflects our unwavering belief that every person deserves the chance to live with dignity, pursue opportunity, and contribute to the flourishing of their community.

SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME 2024/2025 IMPACT



We continue to make significant strides in empowering the next generation of Southern Kaduna leaders through our comprehensive Undergraduate Scholarship Program. In 2024, we successfully paid the tuition fees, accommodation, and living expenses of 36 deserving students currently enrolled in our program across various higher institutions. This holistic approach ensures that our scholars are not only enrolled but are fully supported to focus on their education without the distractions of financial hardship.

Beyond financial assistance, we remain intentional about building relationships with our beneficiaries and monitoring



the long-term impact of our interventions. As part of these efforts, on June 25, 2025, a monitoring and evaluation (M&E) visit was conducted at Kaduna State University (KASU). This campus-based M&E engagement was designed to strengthen the scholarship program, gather real-time feedback, and foster a closer connection between the Foundation and our scholars. During the session, the CMEL Officer, speaking on behalf of the Foundation, explained that the purpose of the visit was to understand the scholars' experiences, measure the impact of the scholarship on their academic and personal development, and identify areas for program improvement.

The feedback from scholars was inspiring and affirming. They expressed deep gratitude to the Foundation for the consistent support, explaining how the scholarship has significantly eased their financial burden. Many reported improvements in their academic performance, enhanced self-confidence, and greater involvement in leadership roles both on campus and within their communities.



SKAID Medical Outreach Initiative

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

As part of our commitment to improving healthcare access in rural communities, we launched the first edition of our medical outreach program across Zangon Kataf, Kagarko, Jaba, Kauru, and Sangga LGAs in Kaduna State. This represents a significant step in addressing critical healthcare needs in areas with limited access to medical facilities and resources.

The outreach delivered essential healthcare services, focused on surgery, vision repairs, and pharmaceutical provisions, while also fostering collaboration with local leaders and healthcare providers to ensure the long-term sustainability of healthcare initiatives.

By gathering community health data, SKAID Foundation seeks to inform future interventions and healthcare planning, thereby enhancing the overall health and

well-being of these underserved communities.

The primary objective of the medical outreaches across the 5 local governments are as follows:

- i. Complement governmental healthcare efforts in regions with limited access to medical facilities and resources.
- ii. Deliver essential healthcare services to the various communities, addressing critical needs in surgery, vision repairs, and pharmaceutical provisions.
- iii. Gather community health data for future interventions and healthcare planning.
- iv. Foster trust and collaboration with local leaders and healthcare providers to ensure long-term sustainability of healthcare initiatives.

Samaru, Zangon-Kataf LGA



The first medical outreach took place from 14th to 15th February, 2025 at ECWA Health Clinic in Samaru, Zangon Kataf LGA. We served over 800 people in need of healthcare. The outreach included outpatient services with general health assessments, chronic disease management, and eye care, providing vision screenings and cataract surgeries. During the medical outreach, a total of 508 medications were distributed to beneficiaries in need of healthcare support. The programme also recorded 79 successful general surgeries and 86 eye surgeries, restoring hope and improving the quality of life for many individuals. In addition, 210 eyeglasses were provided to patients to support better vision and enhance their daily living.





Kubacha, Kagarko LGA



The second medical outreach took place at the Primary Health care Centre Kubacha, Kagarko LGA, Kaduna State, from February 21-22, 2025. We delivered free medical care, identify health priorities, promote eye health, and offer surgical support. Across the two-day outreach, a total of 76 surgeries were successfully performed, alongside dental care provided to 217 patients and 51 eye surgeries conducted. In addition, 753 beneficiaries received medications during the exercise.



Kwoi, Jaba LGA



The third medical outreach took place from February 28 to March 1, 2025, at the Child Welfare Health Centre in Kwoi, Kaduna State, focusing on surgery, vision care, and drug distribution to address healthcare gaps in underserved communities. The two-day medical outreach recorded a total of 72 successful general surgeries and 62 eye surgeries. Extensive vision screenings were also carried out, leading to the distribution of eyeglasses to 161 patients, while 314 beneficiaries received medications during the programme.





Kauru, Kauru LGA



The fourth medical outreach took place from March 14-15, 2025, at Kauru Rural Hospital, Kaduna State. The outreach recorded a total of 97 successful surgical procedures over the two-day programme. Eye care services also had a remarkable impact, with 525 patients screened, 40 eye surgeries successfully conducted, and 150 beneficiaries provided with eyeglasses to support improved vision. Additionally, over 600 individuals received essential medications and benefited from professional healthcare consultations during the outreach.



Sanga LGA



The fifth medical outreach took place in Sanga Local Government Area, Kaduna State, from March 21-22, 2025. The outreach recorded a total of 33 successful surgical procedures over the two-day programme. Eye care services also made a significant impact, with 410 patients screened, 40 eye surgeries successfully carried out, and 200 beneficiaries provided with eyeglasses to improve their vision. In addition, over 500 individuals received essential medications alongside professional healthcare consultations during the outreach.





Trade & Skill Acquisition Program

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

In alignment with the SKAID Foundation's unwavering commitment to fostering sustainable development and empowering communities, the Foundation strategically partnered with the Maryamu & Yakubu Skills Development and Educational Foundation. This collaboration was forged to deliver a comprehensive and impactful Trade & Skill Acquisition Program, a pivotal initiative conceived to address the pressing issues of unemployment and underemployment prevalent within the region.

The program is designed to equip young individuals with practical, highly market-relevant skills to cultivate economic self-sufficiency and catalyse sustainable development throughout the Southern Kaduna region and the broader Kaduna State. Our partnership with MAYSDE Foundation exemplifies a shared vision for community upliftment, leveraging the strengths of both organisations to create lasting positive change.

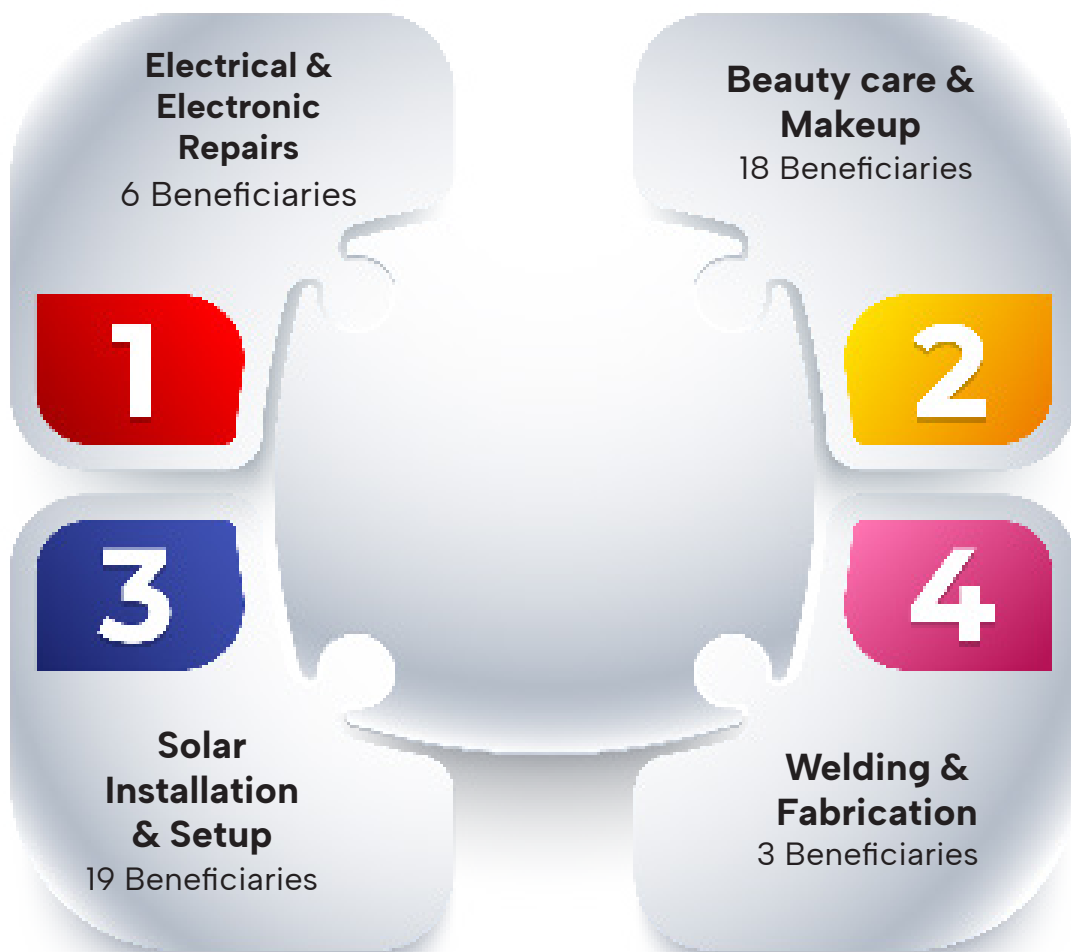
The Trade & Skill Acquisition Program officially commenced with a significant inaugural ceremony held on June 9, 2025, at the Maryamu and Yakubu Skills Development and Educational Foundation in Zangon Kataf. The event served as a formal inauguration of the program, setting an inspiring tone for the intensive training period ahead. The program offered specialised training in four high-demand vocational fields: Electrical & Electronic Repairs, Solar Installation, Welding/Fabrication and Beauty Care & Make-Up

The Trade & Skill Acquisition Program reached its triumphant conclusion with a memorable closing ceremony held on August 8, 2025, at the Maryamu & Yakubu Skills Development and Educational Foundation Centre. The event was not merely a formality but a significant milestone, serving as a joyous celebration of the achievements and dedication of the graduating participants. It marked the successful culmination of two months of intensive training and hard work, transforming aspiring individuals into skilled professionals.

A key highlight of the ceremony was the formal presentation of certificates to all participants who completed the training. These certificates served as official recognition of their newly acquired skills and their commitment to personal and professional development.

Furthermore, in a powerful gesture of empowerment, each graduate received a comprehensive starter pack. These packs, meticulously assembled with tools and materials relevant to their specific trade specialisation, were designed to provide immediate practical support.

To support community development through skill acquisition and entrepreneurship.

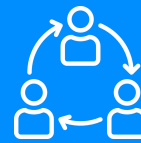

Participant Support and Incentives

Recognising the need for holistic support, the program introduced key incentives to ease financial burdens and boost retention:

Training Allowances: Each participant received ₦50,000, staggered as ₦30,000 Naira in the first month and ₦20,000 Naira in the second month.

Transport Allowances: Given after training, amounts were based on travel distance:

- ₦10,000 for long-distance
- ₦8,000 for medium-distance
- ₦6,000 for short-distance

Starter Packs: Each graduate received a tailored set of essential tools and materials for their trade, enabling them to start earning or secure employment immediately without the cost of buying equipment. The contents of these starter packs were meticulously curated for each skill area:

Women Empowerment Grant Program

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

SKAID Foundation is dedicated to fostering socio-economic development and empowering vulnerable populations within Southern Kaduna. Recognising the pivotal role women play in community development and economic stability, the Foundation launched the Women Empowerment Grant Program. This initiative specifically targets women engaged in small businesses, providing them with crucial financial support to scale their enterprises, enhance their livelihoods, and contribute more significantly to their local economies.

The Women Empowerment Grant Program was initiated as a direct response to the economic challenges faced by women entrepreneurs in Southern Kaduna. Its primary goal was to provide financial assistance to 1,000 women, each receiving ₦20,000 Naira. Beneficiaries were identified through community-led processes in collaboration with traditional leaders, ensuring transparency and inclusivity.



Women's Grant Disbursement

OUR APPROACH

The grant disbursement process was conducted in two main phases to accommodate the geographical spread of beneficiaries and ensure efficient delivery of funds.

Phase I: Kaduna-based Beneficiaries

On September 26, 2025, the Foundation identified about 60 women residing in Kaduna, who were beneficiaries of the grant, and invited them to the SKAID Foundation Office for a formal grant cheque presentation programme. This event served as a symbolic commencement of the disbursement process, allowing for direct interaction with a segment of the beneficiaries and providing an opportunity to highlight the program's objectives and the Foundation's commitment.

Field Presentations of Cheque

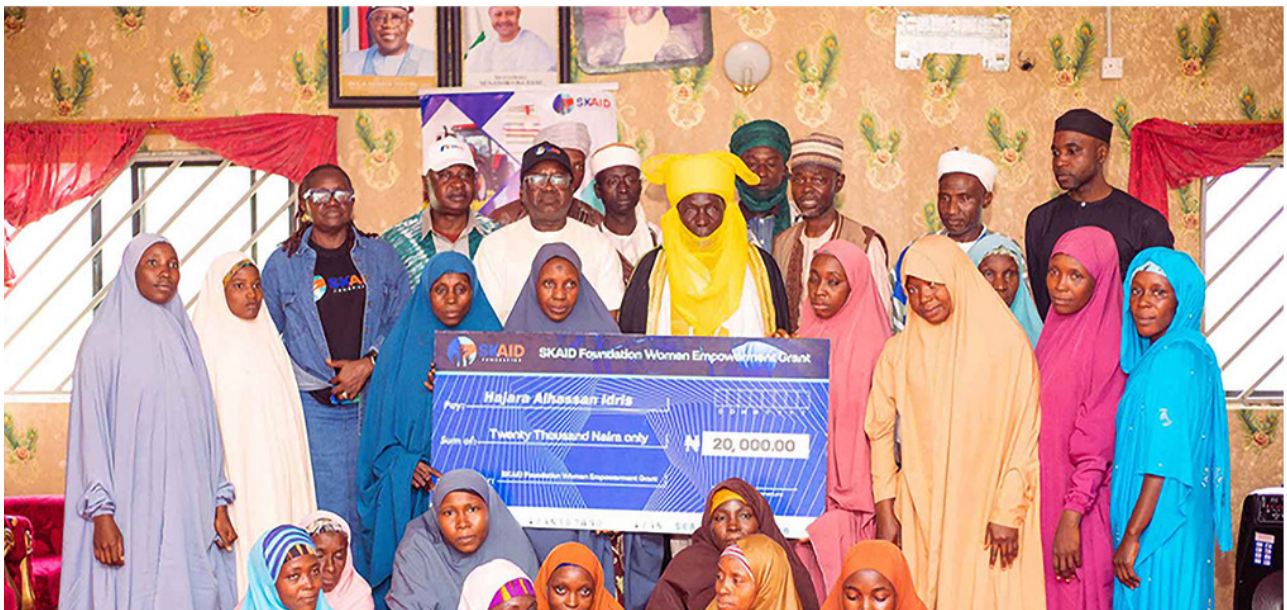
On the 27th of August 2025, we held a Women Empowerment Grant presentation programme at the Agom Kufana Palace in Kufana Chieftdom, Kajuru Local Government Area, Southern Kaduna. During the event, 40 women from Kufana Chieftdom were presented with a dummy cheque by the BOT Chairman of the Foundation, RADM Ferguson D. Bobal, after his speech in the presence of His Highness, Titus Dauda, the Agom Kufana. After the presentation, the Agom Kufana expressed gratitude to SKAID Foundation for the initiative aimed at empowering women within Southern Kaduna and further prayed that God bless the Foundation. Also, a representative of beneficiaries expressed gratitude to the Foundation.



Kajuru Emirate (Kajuru LGA):

Field Presentations of Cheques

Beyond Kufana, Kajuru Emirate was also visited by the SKAID team on 27th August 2025, for a physical grant presentation programme at the Emir's Palace. The Foundation's BOT Chairman introduced the Foundation and its mission and presented a Dummy Check to the 40 women from the Emirate. Following that, His Highness, Alhassan Adamu, Emir of Kajuru, delivered an inspiring address, expressing deep appreciation for the Foundation's efforts. He remarked that if more initiatives like SKAID's were implemented across the region, the overall socio-economic condition would have been substantially improved. The Emir prayed for God's abundant blessings on the Foundation and encouraged the beneficiaries to utilise the grants productively to uplift their families and communities.



Gbagyi Chieftdom (Chikun LGA):

Field Presentations of Cheques

This chieftdom was another physical location for the field presentation ceremony, reaching 68 women entrepreneurs in that area. The ceremony commenced at 3:00 PM at the Esu Chikun Place in Ugwan Boro, Sabon Tashan, Kaduna. Though His Highness the Esu Chikun was unavoidably absent, he was ably represented by Mr. Kakuri Musa, the Sarkin Shanu Gbagyi and other council members. Like in other locations, the Foundation's BOT Chairman introduced the Foundation and its mission and presented a dummy Check to the 68 women from the Chieftdom. On behalf of the Esu Chikun, Mr Kakuri lauded the Foundation for the initiative targeting women and encouraged the beneficiaries to make good use of the grants.







Partnership Meeting with National Directorate of Employment (NDE)

On February 6, 2025, SKAID Foundation Team paid a visit to the National Directorate of Employment (NDE) in Kaduna and had an inspiring meeting with the State Coordinator, Hajiya Halima Waziri. In a fruitful exchange, the Executive Director shared the Foundation's vision and its commitment to transforming lives in Southern Kaduna through education, entrepreneurship, and agriculture.

Mrs. Hajiya Halima Waziri commended SKAID Foundation's dedicated efforts in empowering communities—a vision she described as “what God wants from us.” She expressed the agency's readiness to partner with the Foundation, emphasizing their role in offering various skill development programs and initiatives that align closely with our thematic areas.





Partnership Meeting with Kaduna State Ministry of Human Services and Social Development

On April 30, 2025, SKAID Foundation team paid a strategic visit to the Kaduna State Ministry of Human Services and Social Development. The visit aimed to explore meaningful collaboration opportunities that can drive sustainable youth empowerment and social development across communities in Southern Kaduna.

During the visit, the Executive Director passionately shared SKAID's vision, mission, and thematic focus areas, emphasizing the Foundation's commitment to partnering with government agencies to uplift and empower young people. Mr. Muhammad Inuwa, Director of Youth Empowerment Department, expressed excitement over the impact SKAID Foundation has made within a short time. He welcomed the idea of partnership, affirming that the Ministry's goals are well-aligned with SKAID's mission.

Also present at the meeting were key heads of units within the ministry, including Joseph Abiri, Head of the Registration Unit; Denis Victor, Head of Empowerment; Safaratu Muhammad, Acting Head of the NYSC Unit; and Helen Saiza, Head of the Networking Unit. Mr. Abiri further commended SKAID's impactful work and expressed a strong willingness to collaborate on prospective youth empowerment initiatives.





Partnership Meeting with Teachers Registration Council of Nigeria (TRCN)

On April 30, 2025, SKAID Team visited the Teachers Registration Council of Nigeria (TRCN) in Kaduna for a follow-up discussion regarding our partnership proposal aimed at empowering educators in Southern Kaduna.

During the meeting, Mrs. Esther Natsa, TRCN Coordinator in Kaduna, passionately emphasized the urgent need to equip teachers, particularly in rural communities, with digital skills to enhance productivity and modernize classroom practices. She noted that many educators currently face challenges integrating technology into their teaching, which impacts both their effectiveness and student outcomes.

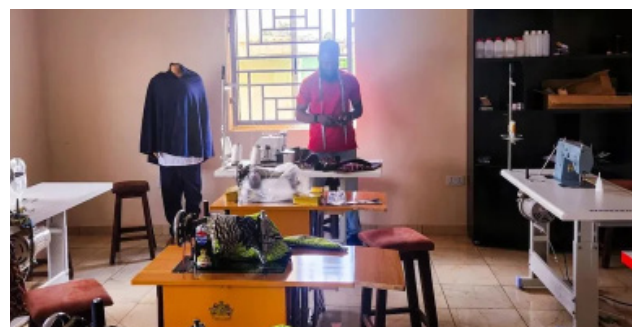
This collaboration between SKAID and TRCN represents a beacon of hope, focusing on empowering Southern Kaduna teachers through three key pillars: supporting them to acquire TRCN licenses, providing essential digital literacy training to boost classroom innovation, and equipping educators with modern tools to revolutionize teaching methods. Together, we aim to bridge the gap between traditional education and the demands of 21st-century learning, ensuring no teacher is left behind in the digital age.



Partnership Meeting with Nigerian Breweries

On July 2, 2025, we held a strategic meeting with Nigerian Breweries at their Kakuri facility in Kaduna. The team was warmly received by Mr. Kabiru Kassim, the Corporate Affairs Manager-North. The engagement focused on exploring partnership opportunities in skill acquisition and capacity building, following the launch of the Maltina Skill Acquisition Centre. Our Executive Director commended Nigerian Breweries for its commitment to human development, emphasizing SKAID's shared vision of empowering communities through impactful, grassroots initiatives.

Mr. Kassim praised SKAID's rapid growth and visible impact, describing capacity building as "an act of love for humanity." He explained that the Centre was created to upskill in-house staff in high-demand trades such as leatherwork, catering, and fashion design, and expressed interest in collaborating with SKAID to expand its reach. The meeting concluded with a tour of the Maltina Skill Acquisition Centre, allowing the SKAID Team to observe firsthand the facilities, and training equipment. The visit reinforced a shared commitment to youth development through practical, skill-based training.





Partnership Meeting with the Embassy of Poland

On June 30, 2024, SKAID Foundation met with representatives of the Embassy of Poland, Mr. Patrick Zajac and Mr. Thomas, at the Embassy in Abuja to discuss potential areas of collaboration aimed at advancing sustainable development in Southern Kaduna. SKAID was represented by Mr. Bello Bissala (Executive Director), Mr. Lucky John (Programs Officer), and Mr. Oluwaseun Ojo (CMEL Officer).

The Executive Director presented SKAID's mission, vision, and key programs in education, healthcare, entrepreneurship, ICT training, and agriculture, emphasizing the Foundation's commitment to equipping underprivileged communities with transformative opportunities.

The Embassy representatives expressed

deep admiration for SKAID's impact and identified several priority areas for collaboration: supporting scholarships for indigent students, facilitating Polish experts' involvement in technical and vocational skills training, partnering on medical outreach programs—especially in ophthalmology and dentistry—and supporting mechanized solutions and value chain development for ginger farming in Southern Kaduna.

The meeting concluded with a commitment to maintain communication and define formal mechanisms for collaboration.

Partnership Meeting with European Union



On May 5, 2025, we held a virtual partnership meeting with the European Union, where our Executive Director, Mr. Bello Bissalla, presented the Foundation's mission and highlighted key initiatives in education and medical outreach. The EU representative, Wynfred Egbuson commended our efforts to improve lives and transform communities, particularly noting our progress since the Foundation's establishment in 2024. While she explained that we do not yet meet their grant eligibility criteria, given our relatively recent establishment and the requirement for a longer track record, she expressed strong enthusiasm for our work.



Partnership Meeting with Keystone Bank

On July 18, 2025, we held a strategic partnership meeting with Keystonebank Nigeria to discuss opportunities for partnership and collaboration on community development initiatives. Keystone Bank was represented by Bashir Yahaya, Zonal Head for Kaduna Zone, as well as Matthew Danjuma and Mary Dan Paul Fredericks.

During the discussions, Keystone Bank expressed a strong interest in partnering with SKAID Foundation, specifically in the implementation and delivery of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) projects within the region. Keystone Bank highlighted their longstanding commitment to driving positive change in Kaduna State, citing their successful implementation of numerous CSR projects in the past. These projects have focused on areas such as education, healthcare, youth empowerment, and financial literacy, demonstrating the bank's dedication to improving the lives of local communities.

Keystone Bank expressed readiness to collaborate with SKAID Foundation by leveraging its institutional experience and resources. Both parties acknowledged the mutual benefits of combining efforts to create deeper, more sustainable impact.
